
































































"WALK to SCHOOL" Safety Maze

Trace your way from Home to School. Remember, you can only cross a street at a corner with a crosswalk! Be sure that the walk sign on the OPPOSITE side shows a Walk signal. You cannot cross if you get the Don't Walk signal.



How to safely cross the street

Make sure that you cross at a corner and use a crosswalk whenever possible. Children under the age of 10 should not cross the street without an adult. Be safe when crossing the street by following these simple steps:

- ·STOP at the edge of the curb;
- ·LOOK left, right, left, and LISTEN;
- ·Make EYE CONTACT and wave to drivers before stepping into the road to make sure you are seen;
- .WALK, do not run across the street;
- .CONTINUE to look and listen for cars as you cross.
